

Export Licensing and Foreign Direct Investment

Advises companies seeking to export U.S. goods, software, and technology that may be controlled by U.S. regulations, such as the Treasury Department's OFAC restrictions on trade with Iran and Russia, the Commerce Department export restrictions on dual use items (Export Administration Regulations), and State Department regulation of the export of defense items (International Traffic in Arms Regulations). Consults on the applicability of the law overseeing foreign investment in U.S. businesses, and on filing notice of foreign investments with the Treasury Department's Committee on Foreign Investment in the U.S. (CFIUS).
