

Why the Main Studio Rule Must Go

For over 50 years, the Federal Communications Commission has required radio and television stations to maintain a "main studio" within or near their communities of license.

On April 20, 2017, GSB filed a petition asking the Commission to get rid of the Main Studio Rule, and shortly after, FCC Chairman Pai stated his agreement and the Commission launched a new rulemaking at its May 18 meeting.
