Although the New Jersey Superior Court handles hundreds of thousands of cases every year, only a relatively small percentage of these ever reach a judge for trial. A great many are resolved through various dispute resolution processes, including arbitration. Arbitration is mandatory statewide for civil cases involving automobile negligence, personal injury, contracts and commercial matters, products liability and personal injury protection suits against one's own insurance carrier for unpaid insurance benefits. Even when it is not mandatory, it is an option utilized by many litigants because it circumvents the expensive litigation process and can save both time and money.

This program will provide vital information and lay the foundation for solid arbitration skills. Topics will include:

- Which cases must be arbitrated, when is it permissive rather than mandatory, and the pros and cons of arbitration
- Setting the goal for the arbitration award – factors to consider for success
- The statement of factual and legal issues
- Selection of the arbitrator – where to look and what to look for
- Pre-trial proceedings – what you need to know
- The conduct of the hearing
