The number of business interruption claims in New Jersey is growing. As more and more businesses have to shutter because of the economic fallout from the pandemic, business owners are looking to their insurance carriers for relief. Some courts have recently held that businesses aren’t covered if their policies contain a specific virus exclusion clause. However, what if there is no such clause? Some policies cover business interruption only if there is a physical loss or damage to the business, but lawyers for business owners have been countering and, in some cases, winning. Their argument that loss of functionality falls within the definition of “direct physical loss or damage” is gaining traction in some courts. Of course, even if the attorney wins the argument, they must prove the monetary value of the damages.
