Glenn Berman, Of Counsel in Greenbaum's Litigation Department and a former Judge of the Superior Court of New Jersey, will participate in a full-day symposium on "Cyberbullying in America: A Discussion of Liability, Policy, and Progress" to be held on Wednesday, April 24, 2013, from 10:00am - 4:00pm, at the Rutgers School of Law - Newark.

The program will include multiple panels discussing issues of criminal liability, civil liability, and policy related to the issue of cyberbullying. Judge Berman will participate in a Criminal Panel on "Prosecuting & Defending an Alleged Cyberbully: The Role of the Criminal Justice System in a Networked Age of Bullying."

Judge Berman has authored published decisions encompassing all four divisions of the Superior Court; General Equity, Family, Civil and Criminal. He was specially designated to preside over the landmark and high profile 2012 cyberbullying case, *State of New Jersey v. Dharun Ravi*. Following his retirement from the bench, Judge Berman joined the Greenbaum firm in January of 2013. His practice focuses in mediation, arbitration, and discovery management of complex family, commercial, estate/probate, and general equity matters, as well as law enforcement investigations.
