Robert S. Goldsmith, co-chair of the firm's Redevelopment & Land Use Department, will moderate a panel discussion entitled "Housing: What Would a Housing Commission Be Thinking About If We Had One?" at the 2016 New Jersey Planning Conference, a two-day educational event sponsored by the New Jersey chapter of the American Planning Association (APA-NJ). The presentation is scheduled for Thursday, January 28, 2016 from 10:45am – 12:15pm at the Hyatt Regency in New Brunswick.
