Ms. Sullivan is a Past President of the Middlesex County Bar Association and continues in the MCBA as a member of the Board, as Chair of the Chancery Practice committee, and in overseeing the volunteer early settlement panel of the chancery court for Middlesex County. She is a Trustee of the New Jersey State Bar Association representing Middlesex County, is co-Chair of the Bar's Equity Jurisprudence Special Committee, and is a member of the NJSBA Amicus, Business and Commercial Litigation Special, and Elections Committees, and the LGBT Rights and Women in the Profession Sections, the latter of which she is a former Trustee. She is a member of the New Jersey Supreme Court Committee on Mandatory Continuing Legal Education, serves as Treasurer of Central Jersey Legal Services, and is a Barrister of the Aldona Appleton Family Law Inn of Court. She is the co-author of two important treatises, "New Jersey Business Litigation" and "Guidebook to Chancery Practice in New Jersey."
