Workplace Violence-What Is It?

Workplace violence is any act or threat of physical violence, harassment, intimidation, or other threatening, disruptive behavior that occurs at the work site. It ranges from threats and verbal abuse to physical assaults and even homicide.

Who Is At Risk? Everyone.

OSHA's research shows that nearly <u>2 million</u> American workers report having been victims of workplace violence each year. Nearly 10% of all workplace fatalities are homicides.

What Responsibility Do You Have?

Employers are obligated under OSHA's General Duty Clause to prepare for emergencies. Other risks, such as liability for negligent hiring/retention claims, the inability to attract top candidates, and public relations issues, could result from a lack of preparedness.
