Judy Greenwald’s article “Cyclist fired for showing her opinion of Trump may have no case” in *Business Insurance* investigates whether the former employee may have a legal claim against her former employer, analyzing the event and other similar recent cases. Among other issues, as Timm Schowalter notes as a part of the article, there may be a question of whether the employer’s social media policy violates Section 7 of the National Labor Relations Act. Timm also mentions that if the case were to be litigated, and if the employer has employment practices liability insurance, it would likely settle quickly.
