

Nova Daly Named to Advisory Board for Center on Sanctions and Illicit Finance, Drawing on Key National Security Experience

Nova J. Daly, senior public policy advisor in Wiley Rein's prominent International Trade Practice, was recently named to the Board of Advisors to the Center on Sanctions and Illicit Finance (CSIF)—a role that will draw on his extensive experience on key national security matters.

At Treasury, he served as Deputy Assistant Secretary for the U.S. Committee on Foreign Investment in the United States (CFIUS) from 2006 to 2009.
