

# Law360 Names Wiley Partners Stephanie Bell and Tara Ward as 'Rising Stars'

Washington, DC - Wiley partners Stephanie M. Bell and Tara L. Ward have been named to *Law360's* prestigious list of 2021 "Rising Stars." Ms. Bell was recognized in the International Trade category, while Ms. Ward was recognized in Government Contracts.

Her work involves a broad range of industries, including steel products, diamond sawblades, stainless steel flanges, phosphor copper, hardwood plywood, and wood flooring. She serves on the Board of Directors for the Customs and International Trade Bar Association, and previously served as Vice-Chair of Programs for the ABA Section of International Law's International Trade Committee.
