Washington, DC—Wiley Rein partner Scott D. Delacourt authored a letter on behalf of the U.S. Chamber Institute for Legal Reform (ILR) as part of last week's U.S. House Energy and Commerce subcommittee hearing on robocalling and caller identification spoofing.

The letter to Commerce Committee Chairman Bob Latta and Ranking Member Jan Schakowsky contained a number of salient points from Mr. Delacourt's prior congressional testimony on April 18 before the U.S. Senate Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation. Both hearings examined issues related to malicious spoofing and abusive robocalls designed to defraud consumers, and the steps government and industry are taking to protect consumers.
